New Way Forward



Vice President Kamala Harris is making history (again!) as the first Black woman and person of South Asian descent to be the presidential nominee of a major US political party. As our "joyful" warrior, she is having an amazing positive impact on political polling, volunteering and voter registration rates across the country.

During her acceptance speech, VP Kamala Harris clearly defined what's at stake in this election: **PERSONAL FREEDOMS**.

FREEDOM to make your own decisions about your own lives, especially on matters of heart and home.

FREEDOM to make your own reproductive health care decisions, when she and a Democratic Congress restore reproductive freedom nationwide.

FREEDOM to breathe clean air, drink clean water and live free from the pollution that fuels the climate crisis.

FREEDOM to love who you love openly with pride.

VP Harris describes her vision of a strong and growing middle class as "an opportunity economy" with plans to lower costs:

- * Up to \$6,000 tax relief for parents of newborns when expenses are highest.
- * Up to \$3600 per child by restoring the expanded Child Tax Credit.
- * Provide first-time homebuyers with \$25,000 to help with a down payment on a new home.
- * Strengthen penalties for price-gouging on groceries, gas, and other essentials.

VP Harris' **tax plan** includes middle class **tax cut** that will benefit more than 100 million Americans, with nearly \$5 trillion in tax increases for the wealthy over a decade:

- * No one making less than \$400,000 a year would see their taxes go up under the plan.
- * Corporate tax rate increase from 21% to 28%.
- * All households with more than \$100 million in net assets would pay a minimum 25% tax.

VP Harris' **foreign policy** will focus on advancing our security and our values abroad, while ensuring America always has the strongest, most lethal **military force** in the world, and always caring for and honoring our troops and their families, their service and their sacrifice.

More plans and policies will be rolling out, as VP Kamala Harris and her running mate, Governor Tim Walz, inspire voters on the campaign trail.

Republicans for Harris?

Georgia Dems Fight Back!

On July 12, Republican members of the Georgia State Election Board (Dr. Janice Johnston, Rick Jeffares and Janelle King) held a meeting to devise **new election rules**. Democratic member Sara Tindall Ghazal and nonpartisan board chair John Fervier were missing.

The rules appear to respect election certification deadlines, allowing for "reasonable inquiry" or "examinations" that wouldn't push certification past the legal deadline. However, these rules could still delay certification by giving officials authority to hunt for ANY kind of election irregularity.

On July 19, the nonpartisan watchdog American Oversight filed a lawsuit against the Board for violating the state's Open Meetings Act by holding the July 12th meeting without the legally required public notice or a quorum.

On Aug. 3 Trump praised all three Republican members by name at a campaign rally, "They're doing a great job", calling them "pit bulls fighting for honesty, transparency and victory."

On Aug. 15, Georgia Secretary of State Brad Raffensperger, called the new rules eleventh-hour "chaos" and stated, "These misguided, last-minute changes from unelected bureaucrats who have never run an election and seem to reject the advice of anyone who ever has could cause serious problems in an election that otherwise will be secure and accurate."

On Aug.19, Democratic state Sen. Nabilah Islam Parkes filed a formal ethics complaint alleging these Republican members broke state law in pushing the new rules so close to the election.

On Aug. 26, Georgia election officials and Democrats filed a lawsuit against the Georgia State Election Board to block the new rules and "prevent chaos" in the November election.

Georgia Democrats and voting rights advocates are also calling for the resignations and investigation by GOP Gov. Brian Kemp of these Republican members.
